PREFACE

On 17 March 1992, the Senior Advisers to ECE Governments on Environmental and Water Problems adopted the *Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes* (E/ECE/1267) in Helsinki. This Convention is intended to strengthen national and international measures to prevent, control and reduce the release of hazardous substances into the aquatic environment, to abate eutrophication and acidification, to ensure rational and ecologically sound water management, and to protect related ecosystems including the marine environment.

Article 17 (2) of the Convention calls upon the Parties to exchange information on experience gained in concluding and implementing bilateral and multilateral agreements and other arrangements for the protection and use of transboundary waters to which one or more of the Parties have acceded. In their decision B(5) adopted in March 1992, the Senior Advisers entrusted the Working Party on Water Problems to undertake activities on such questions as may be deemed important pending the entry into force of the Convention. Among the questions specifically outlined was the compilation and regular updating of information on bilateral and multilateral agreements and other arrangements within the UN/ECE region on the protection and use of transboundary waters.

At its sixth session held in November 1992, the Working Party on Water Problems considered practical ways and means of systematically compiling and regularly updating such information, and decided, as a first step, to finalize and update the lists of agreements prepared in the late 1970s within UN/ECE. These include a *Synoptic List of Existing Conventions and International Agreements Concerning Water Resources in the ECE Region* (WATER/R.69) and a list of *Treaties Concerning the Development, Use and Conservation of Shared Water Resources in the ECE Region* (WATER/R.85), compiled on the basis of information communicated by Governments.

In updating and completing information contained in these documents, amendments and additions were taken into account which were provided by Austria, Canada, Croatia, Czech Republic, Finland, Germany, Hungary, Netherlands, Norway, Poland, Romania, Russian Federation, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Spain and Switzerland. Information contained in United Nations and other related documents, including the publication of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) on *International Treaties Concerning the Non-navigational Uses of International Water Courses - Europe* (FAO Legislative Study No. 49), was also taken into account.

The present document is issued pursuant to the decision taken by the Senior Advisers on Environmental and Water Problems at their sixth session (ECE/ENVWA/29, paragraph 27 (b)). It will be revised and updated annually by the Working Party on Water Problems. At three-yearly intervals a completely revised and updated version of the consolidated list of agreements will be prepared for wide dissemination.

In accordance with established practice, the list of *Bilateral and Multilateral Agreements and other Arrangements in Europe and North America on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Waters* is published under the sole responsibility of the secretariat. 1/

INTRODUCTION

The present document presents in a chronological order existing bilateral and multilateral legally binding agreements and other arrangements in Europe and North America on the protection and use of transboundary waters, which had been concluded by May 1992. These include agreements, treaties, conventions, protocols, orders and exchanges of notes.

For each agreement the following information is given: title of the agreement, field of application, river basin, area of application, contracting parties, date of agreement and place of signature, joint body, and reference.

(a) Title of the agreement

This entry gives either the original title of the agreement or a translation, if the original title(s) is(are) not in the respective working language of UN/ECE. In the latter case, full use was made of translations contained in the treaty series of the League of Nations or the United Nations, as well as translations provided by the relevant contracting parties. For original titles in languages other than the UN/ECE working languages, documents WATER/R.85 and ENVWA/WP.3/R.27/Add.2 might be consulted.

(b) Field of application

This entry contains a brief description of the field(s) of application of the agreement, as follows: qualitative and quantitative protection of water resources, water supply, irrigation, hydropower production, floods, regulating or hydraulic development, water management of transboundary waters, fishery, and navigation.

The composite term "*quantitative and qualitative protection of water resources*" covers a complex of activities, such as the protection of water resources against overuse as well as the prevention, control and reduction of water pollution. Monitoring of water quality and measurements related to water levels and flow rates are implicitly covered under this term. The terms "quantitative protection of water resources" and "qualitative protection of water resources" are used if an agreement covers exclusively quantity or quality aspects, respectively. In some cases a more specific description of the fields of application is given in order to highlight those aspects of an agreement which are of particular relevance to the Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes. Examples include: "protection of waters against industrial pollution"; "control of accidental pollution"; "joint treatment of waste water"; "control and reduction of municipal and industrial waste-water discharges"; "control of discharges containing radioactive material"; "protection against thermal pollution"; "prevention, control and reduction of eutrophication"; "conservation of water quality"; "protection of aquatic ecosystems"; "protection of groundwaters"; and "erosion control".

The term "*water supply*" covers activities concerning the supply of water both for municipal and industrial use.

The term "*irrigation*" covers water supply for irrigation and other agricultural activities, such as water supply for livestock.

The term "*hydropower production*" denotes the in-stream use of surface waters for the production of electricity. Usually, this implies hydraulic engineering activities, such as the construction of dams, regulating and the hydraulic development of catchment areas.

The term "*floods*" covers mainly activities regarding the control of floods. In some cases the control of other hydrological extreme events, such as droughts and ice drifts, is implicitly included under this term.

The terms "*regulating*" and "*hydraulic development*" both cover activities regarding man-made modification to the location, width or depth of the bed of a surface water body, modifications to its water regime, water-construction works, and the maintenance of river banks. The term "*hydraulic development*" implies, however, that regulating activities cover the development of a whole catchment area or parts thereof to create appropriate conditions for in-stream and off-stream water uses.

The term "*water management of transboundary waters*" is used when a more detailed description of the fields of application of the agreement could not be given. The term covers a complex of joint activities to protect transboundary waters against pollution, overuse and negative effects resulting from hydrological extreme events; to provide for water supply; etc.

The term "*fishery*" denotes any activity to control fish in surface waters. The agreements listed under this category contain, as a rule, provisions regarding the protection and/or conservation of aquatic ecosystems in order to allow sustainable fishery. In some cases specific reference is made to such additional provisions of an agreement.

The term "*navigation*" indicates the use of the water body for navigation purposes. Agreements listed contain provisions regarding regulation, hydraulic development and/or provisions regarding the protection of water resources. Agreements concerning the transport of substances hazardous to water, and the buoing or lightening of rivers are not listed.

(c) *River basin*

This entry gives the name of the first order river basin communicating directly with the final recipient of water (oceans, closed inland seas or lakes).

(d) *Area of application*

This entry lists the names of transboundary water bodies, the catchment area or relevant part(s) of it to which the agreement applies. In some cases more general terms are used, such as "all surface waters which form or cross the frontier between the two States" and "surface waters which form or cross the frontier between the two States".

(e) *Contracting parties*

This entry lists the present contracting parties to the agreement. In a number of instances, the fact that newly created States in Europe have assumed full responsibility under existing agreements is reflected. The listing of contracting parties shall, however, not be understood as prejudging the position of the States concerned with regard to specific agreements.

(f) *Date of agreement and place of signature*

This entry informs about the date of signature of the agreement, the place of signature, and related dates as to its entry into force and renewal(s).

(g) *Joint body*

This entry gives, as appropriate, the name of the joint body responsible for the implementation of the agreement.

(h) *Reference*

This entry lists sources of information, including bibliographic sources for additional information. The list of abbreviations is presented in the annex.

PREFACE

The exchange of information on experience gained in concluding and implementing bilateral and multilateral agreements and other arrangements for the protection and use of transboundary waters is part of the activities of the ECE Working Party on Water Problems under the Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes (E/ECE/1267), which was adopted at Helsinki on 17 March 1992. This Convention is intended to strengthen national and international measures to prevent, control and reduce the release of hazardous substances into the aquatic environment, to abate eutrophication and acidification, to ensure rational and ecologically sound water management, and to protect related ecosystems including the marine environment.

The present document is issued pursuant to the decision taken by the Committee on Environmental Policy at its first session (ECE/CEP/1) to revise and update annually the 1993 list of Bilateral and Multilateral Agreements and Other Arrangements in Europe and North America on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Waters (ECE/ENVWA/32) and to publish a completely revised and updated version of the consolidated list of agreements at three-yearly intervals. By 31 December 1994, additions and amendments to this document had been submitted by the delegations of Austria, Croatia, Netherlands, Russian Federation and Slovakia. These have been incorporated into the present document.

In accordance with established practice, the 1994 update is published under the sole responsibility of the secretariat. 1/

The exchange of information on experience gained in concluding and implementing bilateral and multilateral agreements and other arrangements for the protection and use of transboundary waters is part of the activities of the ECE Working Party on Water Problems under the Convention on the Protection and Use of Transboundary Watercourses and International Lakes (E/ECE/1267), which was adopted at Helsinki on 17 March 1992. This Convention is intended to strengthen national and international measures to prevent, control and reduce the release of hazardous substances into the aquatic environment, to abate eutrophication and acidification, to ensure rational and ecologically sound water management, and to protect related ecosystems including the marine environment.
